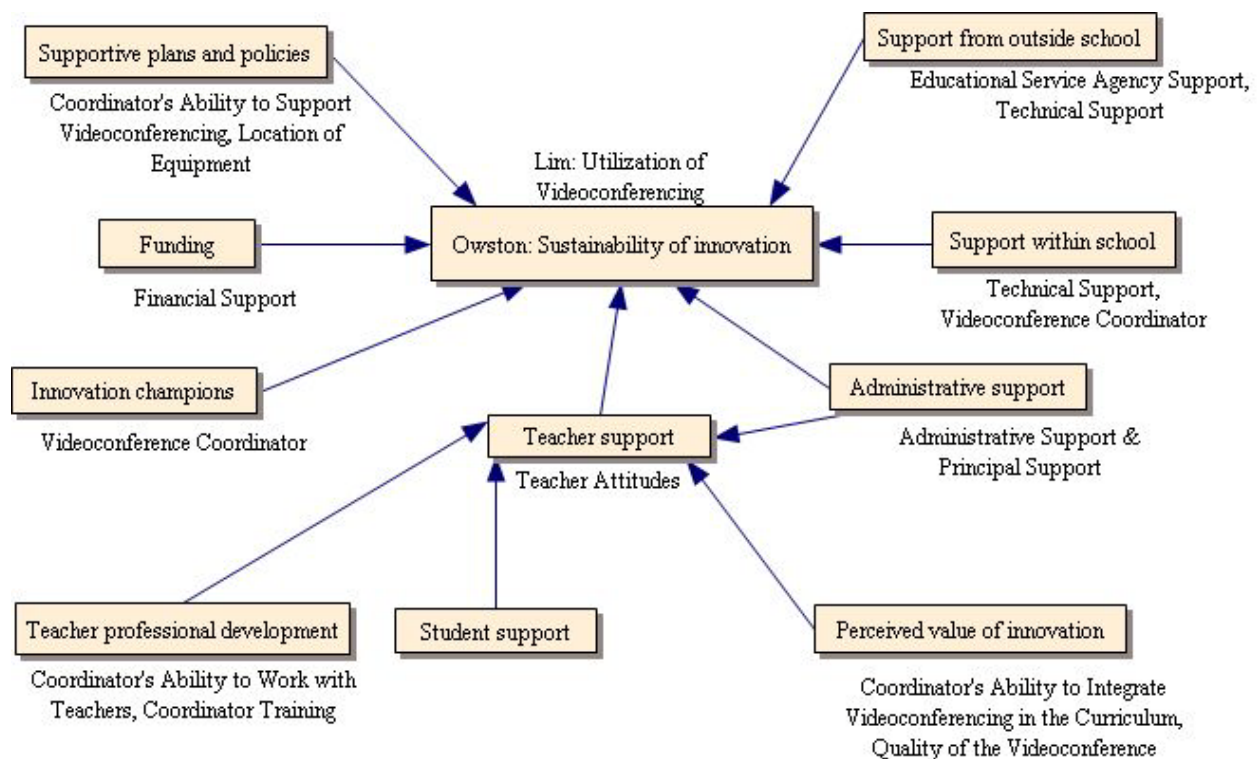

Connections to Theoretical Framework

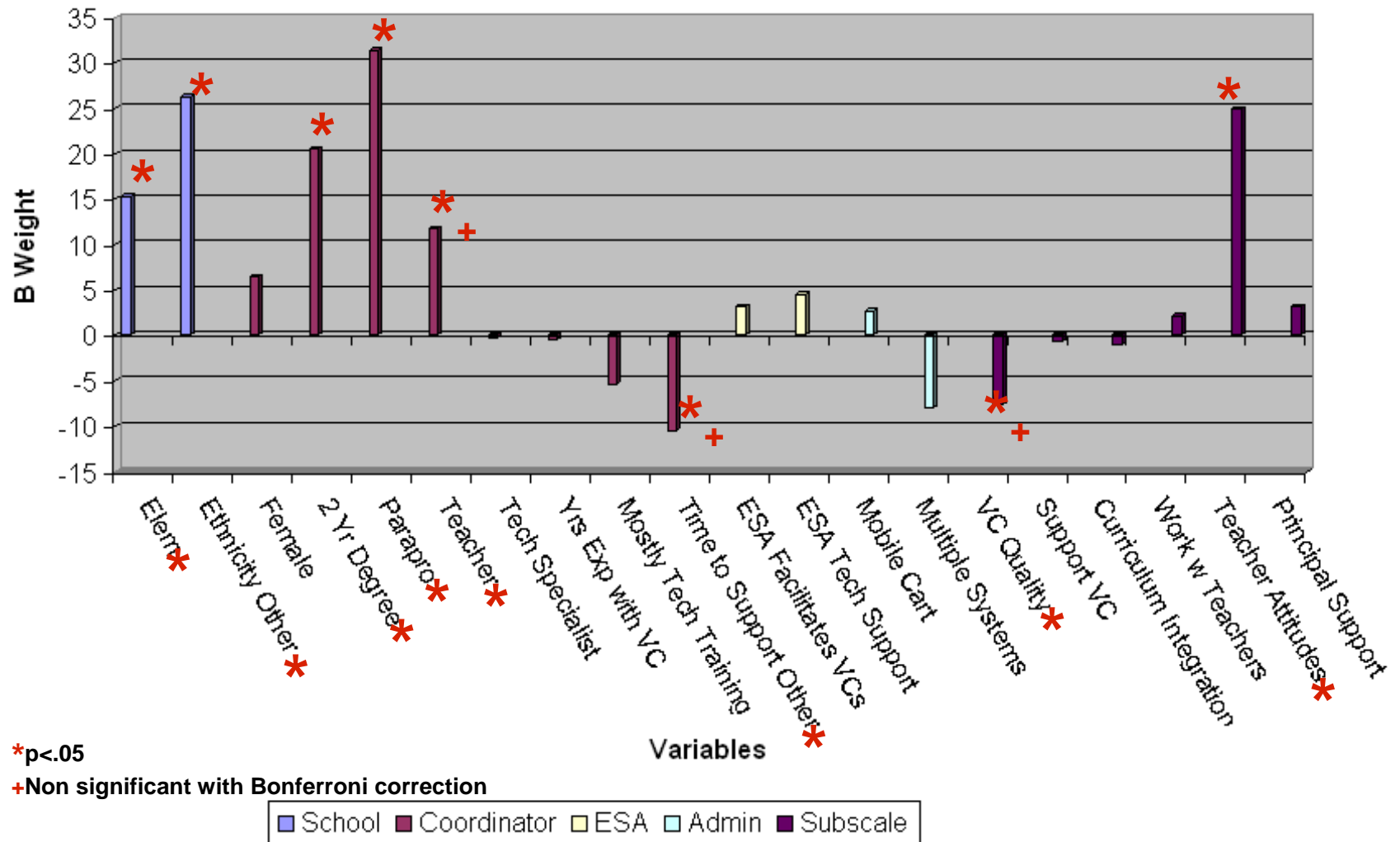
